# **BEACHES**



The beaches are one of the greatest assets of the Village.

Unfortunately we have lost a tremendous amount of

beach area due to storms and erosion over the past two years.

Grand Beach is not the only area affected as this is happening along the shoreline from here to New Buffalo and even further north.

There is no beach in many locations, and beach easements in those locations are closed for that reason.

**SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK...**Please remember to watch your children closely as the Village has joined many other communities that no longer have lifeguards due to budget restraints and the difficulty in finding lake certified lifeguards.

## **CAUTION – LAKE & BEACH CHANGES**

Due to the very serious erosion of the beaches, residents should be aware that the lake bottom drops off quickly and the water is deeper than might be expected. Parents of small children should take note of the deeper water near the shore, and anticipated strong rip currents all along the beach.

Metal and concrete obstructions are now exposed on the beach, and under water. Diving into the lake is hazardous and not advised.

**Beach Fires** require a permit issued by the Police Department. The applicant is required to clean up the area after the beach fire.

**DOGS** are allowed on the beach from May 1<sup>st</sup> through October 1<sup>st</sup> between the hours of 6 p.m. EST and 11 a.m. EST. They are allowed at all times between October 2<sup>nd</sup> and April 30<sup>th</sup>, unless the beach is closed.



# SUBMERGED WATER HAZARD NO JUMPING OR DIVING OFF THE PIER

The pier and surrounding area is very dangerous. Extreme accidents can and have resulted from diving off of, or swimming near the pier. For safety reasons, swimmers should avoid this area.

Keep an eye on your children to ensure that they are not on or near the pier.

#### **GOLF CARTS**

Golf carts must be registered by June 10th. If not registered, the cart will not be allowed on the golf course or on the streets, and the driver will be ticketed and fined \$100. Please pick up your sticker in the Pro-Shop once you have paid the fee.

#### **GOLF CART RULES**

All cart operators must be <u>at least 14 years old</u> to drive on the <u>golf course</u>. Cart operators must be <u>16 years old and have a valid driver's license</u> to drive on the <u>streets</u>.

- You must obey all traffic laws: Stop at stop signs.
   Drive in correct direction on one-way street.
   Allow faster traffic to pass.
- Cart must have a working headlight and tail light to operate at night.
- The number of persons on the cart must not exceed the seating capacity of the cart.
- All persons must be in a seat.
- Children cannot be held on driver's lap.
- The driver's ability to safely operate the cart must not be impaired by too many people in the seat.
- No riding backwards on the front of the cart.
- No riding on the back where the clubs are strapped in.
- All carts must be registered with Grand Beach and have an annual sticker on them. Carts that have been rented from an outside agency must be registered, even if they are only rented and in Grand Beach for a couple of days. Temporary stickers are available at the pro-shop for rental carts. If you don't have a current sticker, you will be fined \$100
- Carts are not allowed on the golf course beginning a half hour after dark until a half hour before dawn.
- Operating a cart after dark without lights is prohibited.

Make sure that your family and guests are aware of these rules and that they follow them.

Report any golf cart infractions to the Police Dept. at (866) 630-7679. These few simple rules should help keep our streets safe.

# SWIMMING POOLS AND IRRIGATION SYSTEMS

The Village requires that every in ground pool and irrigation system be inspected every year by a professional to be sure there is a backflow preventer in place and working properly.

The inspection should be done before using your pool or sprinklers for the first time this year. If you have any questions concerning your back flow prevention device, please contact Village Water Superintendent, Bob Dabbs at (269) 469-1270.

# **ONE-WAY STREET**



Lakeview Avenue is a one-way street from Memorial Day through Labor Day weekend. Please be aware that the waste removal and recycle trucks will

travel westbound along Lakeview on Mondays and Fridays for trash pick-up. If there is a holiday, they will be traveling westbound on the day after their normal scheduled pick-up day.

#### **LANDSCAPING**

Landscapers must haul away all debris, leaves, brush or lawn waste that they generate. They can not dump yard waste on Village or private property.

#### TRASH AND RECYCLING

Trash is picked up by Able Disposal on Monday year around with an extra pickup on Friday between July 1 and the Friday after Labor Day.

Place carts curbside by 7:00 a.m. EST - 6:00 a.m. CST. If the pick up day is a holiday, the pick up will be on Tuesday.

Do not place carts near cars, poles or other stationary objects as the automatic arm on the truck will not be able to pick up the cart, and your trash will not be emptied.

If you are missed, call ABLE DISPOSAL at (800) 828-2253.

You may leave one large item out for pick up each week. Call Able Disposal to make arrangements for the pick up of the large item. You will be charged a fee for any items containing Freon.

It is your responsibility to remove the trash and recycle carts from the edge of the street after they are emptied.

#### **PARKING STICKERS**

Grand Beach logo parking stickers and are available in the Village office and are the same stickers as used in the past. It is

not necessary to get a new sticker if you currently have one on your vehicle. The village requests a sticker be placed on each car that will be parking in the Village on a frequent basis. The first sticker per family is free, additional stickers may be purchased for \$2.00 each.

# HELP PROTECT OUR WATERWAYS

There are many things that take place in everyday life that can affect the quality of water in Lake Michigan and

White Creek. Stormwater runoff can have negative affects on our environment. When chemicals, oil, grease, salt, etc. are carried into our rivers, lakes and streams, all of these bodies of water become polluted. Pollution of our waters may not be immediate, but in time. as the pollutants keep appearing and chemicals increase, our waters may become unusable for fishing, swimming, skiing, and other water sports. Please help protect our waterways and do not pollute!

#### **BUILDING PERMITS**

Building Permits are required for all new construction, pools, roofs, decks, fence, additions and repairs to your home. If your home is located in a high erosion or critical dune area, you will probably need a DEQ permit prior to applying for a building perming.

**Building Certificates** are required when performing maintenance to homes. Examples include painting, plaster repairs, siding, replacing a door or window, etc. Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator Bill Lambert can be reached at (269) 208-9544 for any questions regarding building permits.

#### SUMMER HOURS OF CONSTRUCTION

All construction work with a permit or certificate is allowed only Monday-Friday 8 a.m.-5 p.m. EST. No construction (by homeowner or contractor) is allowed on Saturdays, Sundays or Holidays, except on Saturdays from 8 a.m-5 p.m. EST beginning after Labor Day weekend and ending the Saturday before Memorial Day weekend.

Work may be conducted inside a fully enclosed building or structure having a full roof, all windows, all doors and garage doors completely installed on any day of the week between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. EST, provided that such interior work shall not require the use of any construction equipment outside or in an open garage. Work shall not be audible from outside of the property lines where the building is located. Please be respectful to others and follow these hours when working on your house. ### **ELIMINATE BROKEN WATER PIPES**

If you are going to be away from home for an extended period of time, have your water turned off and your lines cleared out so that you don't experience frozen pipes and damage to your home. If you choose to keep your water on, please make sure that your furnace is working, and have someone check the furnace and the house often while you are away. Many people have experienced extensive water damage to their homes over the winter months due to frozen and broken water lines.

#### WATER TURN ON AND OFF FEES

Plan ahead if you need your water turned on or turned off. If you request that your water be turned on or off after regular water department hours, on weekends or on holidays,

you will be charged a \$75 fee to cover the cost. Be sure to inform family and friends that they should plan ahead if they are using your home and will need the water turned on or off to insure that you are not charged a \$75 fee. Many times young people come to Grand Beach to use their parents' home and request that the water be turned on after hours. If this happens, you will be charged the \$75 fee.

#### **RAIN GARDENS**

Consider planting a rain garden to do your part for clean water! Rain gardens are designed to collect runoff from a roof or parking lot to allow water to be absorbed into the soil. More information is available at www.raingardens.org.

### WHAT IS STORMWATER?

Stormwater is the flow of water on the ground immediately after precipitation - rain or snowmelt.

After a rainfall, some of the precipitation is infiltrated into the soil, some of it is taken up by plants, and some is evaporated back into the atmosphere and the rest runs off land surfaces and other impervious areas. Unfortunately, the stormwater run off picks up any oil, grease, chemicals, nutrients, metals, even bacteria as it travels across land. Heavy rainfall or snowmelt can cause sewer overflow, which will also be carried by the stormwater. All of these chemicals and pollutants will then enter our lakes, rivers, and streams.

# **LEAF PICK UP**

Leaves must be placed in brown biodegradable bags once the Village stops picking up the loose leaves in the spring. Fall clean-up of loose leaves will take place from November 1<sup>st</sup> to December 9, weather permitting.

Please have all of your leaves at the edge of the street at one time. Do not place the leaves on the street. Do not mix sticks, stones, rocks and yard waste with the leaves as they could injure someone when vacuumed in to the machine.

Branches, brush and twigs need to be bundled in 4' lengths to be picked up by the street department.



- Fireworks are only legal the day before, day of and day after a Federal holiday and only on private property.
- Fireworks are NOT allowed on any public property.
- Fireworks are NOT allowed from 1:00 a.m. -8:00 a.m. EST.

Stay safe when handling fireworks of any kind and make sure childen are supervised.

# HOUSEHOLD CHEMICALS & ELECTRONICS JUNE 18th, 9 A.M.- 1 P.M. EST

New Buffalo Township Fire Station, 17655 Clay St., just south of the intersection of Red Arrow Highway/Route 12/Clay Street in New Buffalo.

A partial list of items accepted: Used motor oil, yard & garden chemicals, anti-freeze, gas, stain, oil-based paint, batteries, unwanted pills and medications, medical needles/sharps, mercury items, compact fluorescent light bulbs, unwanted electronics, small appliances, power tools, TV's and computer monitors.

\$10/computer monitor and \$20/television (all types) hazardous waste fee.

Items not accepted: Tires, gas grill propane tanks, ammo, fireworks, waste from businesses and latex paint. Latex paint can be dried out and placed with regular trash. Leave the lid off paint can to dry it.

#### RENTAL PACKETS

Rental packets to be used if you rent your house to others are available in the Clerk's office. The packets contain rules regarding fires, dogs, trash and other matters that renters should be aware of. Informed renters should alleviate complaints.

Due to increased rental complaints such as excess trash, parking, fireworks and noise; the Village adopted a rental permit program on August 20, 2014 for properties with rental complaints.

Rental complaints such as these will require that the owner apply for a "Special Land Use Permit" which involves registration, inspection, certification, a public hearing and displaying of applicable ordinances in order to continue to rent as provided in the resolution.

DOGS OR OTHER PETS are not allowed on the



golf course or in the parks, and are only allowed on the beaches between 6 p.m. EST and 11 a.m. EST during the summer. All pets must be on a leash when not confined to their own yard per Michigan

State Law and Grand Beach Ordinances. State Law requires pets to have annual immunization shots. Please be kind to your neighbors and clean up after your pets.

#### **SEPTIC SYSTEM MAINTENANCE**

Remember to have your septic system checked and pumped every 2-3 years to insure that it is working properly. Without regular maintenance, a septic system will fail.

Protect your drinking water and the environment. A properly working septic system will remove pollutants and disease-causing bacteria and viruses such as E. coli.

Save money and protect your investment in your home. It only costs about \$150 every 3 years to maintain your system, while a new system could cost thousands.
